Member of the Youth Parliament for Telford & Wrekin speaks at the House of Commons

Austin Jijo, the current Member of Youth Parliament (MYP) for Telford and Wrekin recently attended the House of Commons sitting organised by the UK Youth Parliament. He joined over 300 young people from across the UK and Overseas Territories to debate the issues most important to their constituents.

Austin had been elected by MYPs across the Midlands Region to give the speech at the close of the debate that asked for votes for 16 and 17 year olds and better political education. The motion was voted by MYPs to be one of the main issues that the UK Youth Parliament would be campaigning on over the next 12 months.

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Improving the way Ofsted inspects education - open consultation

Ofsted Open Consultation

Ofsted are currently consulting on what you think about their proposed plans for inspecting schools and other settings where children and adults learn.

Ofsted propose a change to the way inspections are reported to parents and/carers. The proposed changes include the creation of a report card which will contain more detailed information than is contained in current reports,

along with a new 5-point grading scale evaluating more areas of a setting's work

All Ages Carers Centre - Young Carers Provision

Young carers may have to deal with a range of illnesses with the person they care for, such as disability, chronic illness, mental health difficulties or problems with drugs or alcohol misuse.

They may take on all types of caring responsibilities - cooking, cleaning, shopping and other practical homecare or personal care such as lifting, washing and toileting. They may give emotional support. Many carers take on caring responsibilities that an adult would normally do. With the risk of social isolation, bullying, school attendance problems, and physical and mental ill health themselves, young carers can often find life tiring, worrying and lonely.

Grants of up to £500 for young people

Young people could get a cash boost of up to £500 to help them take the next step in their career with the return of a popular Telford & Wrekin Council initiative.

This week, the Council has launched the Leader and Cabinet Members' Young Person Grant scheme for 2025.

To be eligible for the grant, the young person must live in Telford & Wrekin - or be a child in care or care leaver living outside of the Borough. They must be aged between 15 years (and in Year 11) and 25 years at the close of applications.

To apply, young people should say how the funding would help them access education, employment, or training or how they could use the money to start their own business.

Applications close at 5pm on Friday 16 May 2025.



The exact dates for Eid will be confirmed based on the sighting of the moon for the new month, as Eid-ul-Fitr is on the 1st day of the 10th Islamic month. This method of moon sighting is a common practice used to determine the start of a new Islamic month around the world.
